



The mouth is the gateway to the body

yet most regard this area as merely a collection of teeth. Many do not consider that teeth are surrounded by soft tissue, bone; innervated by nerves and nourished by vessels. These nerves and vessels connect to other areas in the body including the cardiac, endocrine and kidney systems. Medical research has cited that certain oral conditions such as gum disease can adversely affect these systems possibly causing heart disease, diabetes, and kidney problems.

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* Periodontitis is a constant potential source of infection and has been considered as a separate risk factor for some cardiovascular, endocrine, and renal system related abnormalities.

Dental Decay is the most chronic childhood disease. The effects of this disease is causing more than 52 million school hours to be lost annually. Pregnant women with periodontal disease may be at a higher risk of having problems such as miscarriages, early delivery or low birth weight babies. And the children of women with current tooth decay, or a moderate amount of decay in the past, are more likely to get cavities before the age of 5. Bringing together the forces of OB-GYN, Pediatricians and Nutritionists will forge dialogue to promote change and continue to expand oral care in women and children.

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- * Studies show that women with advanced periodontal disease, were more likely to give birth before the 37th week of pregnancy and deliver babies weighing less than 5.5 pounds.


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* More than 35 million Americans do not have any **teeth**, and 178 million people in the U.S. are **missing** at least one **tooth** which affects nutrition and social interaction.
